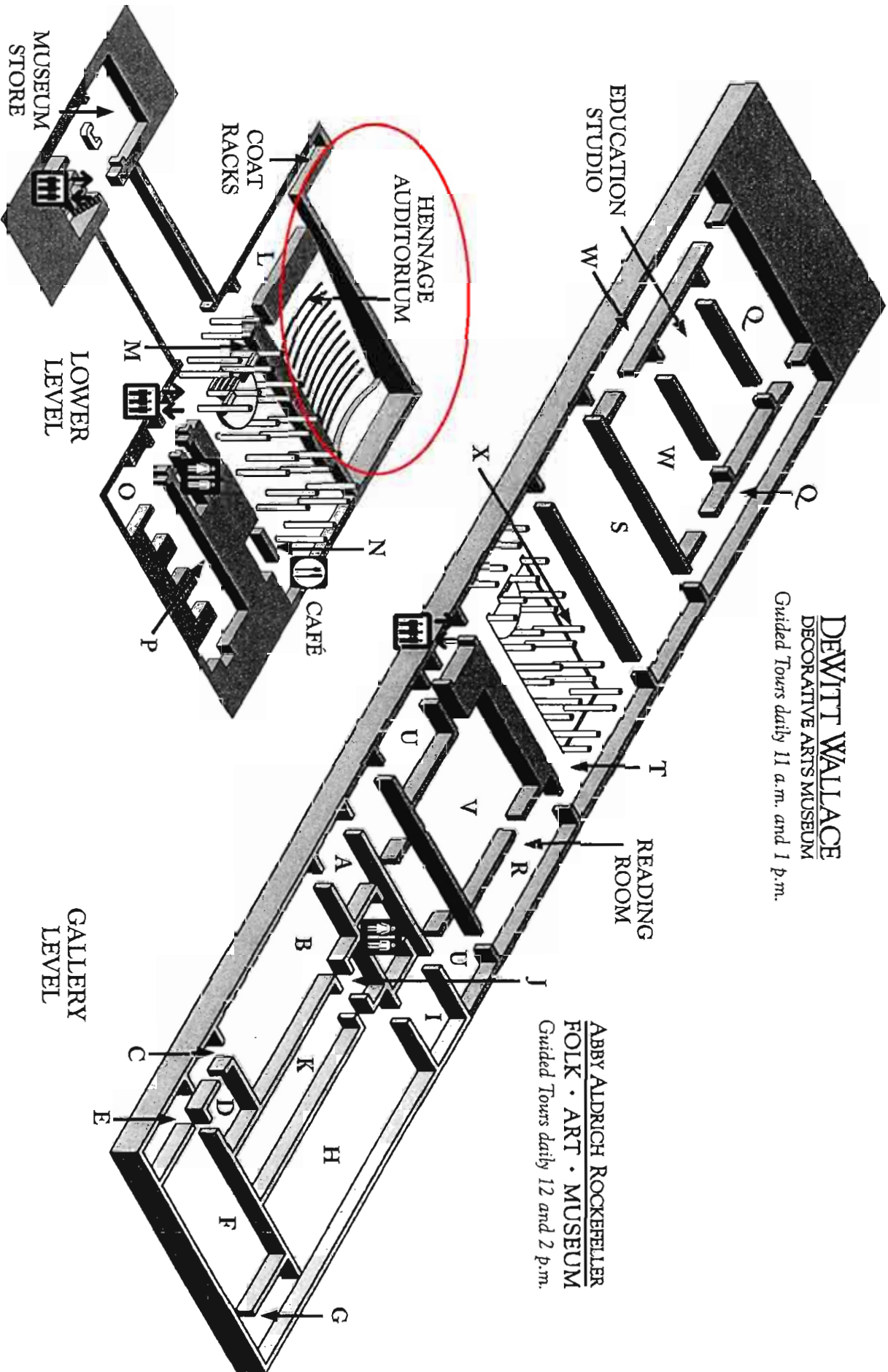

## ABBY ALDRICH ROCKEFELLER FOLK ART MUSEUM

- A** *Introduction to American Folk Art* Learn about the museum and collector Abby Aldrich Rockefeller.
- B** *We the People: Three Centuries of American Folk Portraits* Explore how portraits have changed over time.
- C** *Exciting Expressions: Painted Furniture* Investigate how plain wooden pieces are transformed with color, pattern and designs.
- D** *Conserving the Carolina Room* Follow the current research and conservation of a 19th-century painted room.
- E** *Inspiration and Ingenuity: American Stoneware* Examine the tradition of decorating utilitarian stoneware.
- F** *Down on the Farm* Join Prince, a carved wooden dog, in a family-friendly exhibition as he meets barnyard friends.
- G** *The Art of Steve Harley* View the only surviving paintings which are owned by the museum that capture the natural beauty of the Pacific Northwest.
- H** *Sidewalks to Rooftops: Outdoor Folk Art* Examine weathervanes, carousel animals and other art that enlivened the American landscape.
- I** *Cross Rhythms: Folk Musical Instruments* See a piano built into a chest of drawers and a record-playing hippocerosus.
- J** *Scenes of Everyday Life: The Drawings of Lewis Miller* Examine detailed drawings showing the places he visited and the people he encountered.
- K** *Seeing Stars in American Bedcovers* Enjoy 19th- and 20th-century bedcoverings with star patterns. THROUGH May 16th

- L** *Pounds, Pence and Pistareens: The Coins and Currency of Colonial America* Explore money from the pockets of our colonial ancestors.
  - M** *Lock, Stock, and Barrel* Examine military and civilian weapons before 1800.
  - N** *Artistry and Ingenuity* Discover the practical and aesthetic sides of colonial kitchen equipment.
  - O** *Identifying Ceramics: The Who, What and Ware* Investigate 18th-century production and decoration techniques.
  - P** *Treasure Quest: Great Silver Collections from Colonial Williamsburg* Discover a variety of 18th-century British silver forms.

  - S** *American Furniture: From Virginia to Vermont* Discover how location influenced construction and decoration.
  - T** *Masterworks* Behold splendid examples of British and American antiques from 1660 to 1820.
  - U** *Revolution in Taste* Encounter rich and colorful choices in 18th-century table and tea wares.
  - V** *Quilted Fashions* Explore the use of quilting in the 17th and 18th centuries.
  - W** *Pottery with a Past: Stoneware in Early America* Discover vessels for drinking, dining, and storage from England, Germany, and early America.
  - X** *Declarations of Independence* Discover five 19th-century copies of this famous document.
